#### VILLAGE HALL NEWS

A very successful Christmas lunch has recently taken place, organised by the village hall committee and funded by the beer festival. It was held at The New Inn, Abthorpe on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> December and



attended by both past and present village residents, bringing the number to twenty-two. I think it's the most we ever had at one of our Christmas meals. The food and service were excellent and, in having the downstairs restaurant to ourselves, the atmosphere was both cosy and congenial. It's certainly a venue we'll be using again.

The committee has organised another **quiz evening** to be held in the spring. This will be on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> April and instead of the usual fish and chips we have decided to use the services of a local wood-fired pizza company. Contact has been made with our insurance company and surveys carried out to ascertain the extent of the problem. It appears that trees around the perimeter of the gravelled area at the back of the hall are drying the soil to such an extent that the clay, on which the hall is built, is cracking and causing problems. This ongoing situation is currently being monitored by our insurance company.

A relatively quiet period for the Parish Council this quarter, but we are still concentrating on trying to bring the village together with a couple of initiatives.



#### Welcome book and Village directory

We have started to update our village welcome book, which we can use for anyone who has recently arrived in the village, and in addition we are also trying to collect the names and addresses of everyone in the village, so we can produce a comprehensive village directory. I would urge everyone to complete the survey form we sent out recently so that we can make it as detailed as possible; it will be a great way to know who lives where and make meeting the neighbours that much easier.

#### Budget

At the last meeting we agreed our budget for the next financial year. We have managed to reduce our precept request from SNC by over 5% by moving some of our expenses between other easily accessible funds, so we can still support the village requirements without asking for more money to do it. I would like to thank Paul Featherstone for all his hard work on this.

#### From your Rector.....

Have you given anything up for Lent this year? – The nation's favourite Lenten abstinences are chocolate and alcohol.

But don't worry if you find yourself cheating, it is reckoned that 80% of those good intentions go by the wayside within the first month.



Keeping focused on any goal can be hard and we all need a bit of help. As Christians we believe that help comes from God, and we get it by a constant dialogue of prayer and worship.

And over the next two months our Churches will be entering the time set aside in the Church's year when we devote ourselves to more of this prayer and worship as we follow Christ's journey to the Cross and beyond. You see, as Christians, we take things on, not give them up, for Lent. Our Lent and Holy Week worship offer a variety of ways to do this, and you are more than welcome to come along to any of these services.

During Lent, we will also be holding our **popular weekly Lent Course**. This allows those who come along to explore matters of faith and learn for themselves what the Bible actually says in relaxed group sessions, after watching clips from television and film.

And as well as our courses we will be holding a few "tasters" during this time for those who are curious about the Bible, Christianity or Church. **One of these will be our Lent Cinema at Helmdon Church** where will be offering some

Hollywood films that explore faith and or Christianity as well as simply providing some "Flicks in the Sticks" over the next two months.

On March 14<sup>th</sup> we are holding a special Lent Soup lunch in the Village Hall from 12.30pm to 1.30pm with a bowl of delicious homemade soup and a fresh baked roll. Donations for the lunch will be going towards the work of Christian Aid.

Then on **Maundy Thursday, March 29<sup>th</sup> we will be** enacting the ancient ritual of "stripping" the church for Good Friday. We cover statues and store away most of 'adornments" that make our church so beautiful. This is to remind us of the stark reality of Christ's death and is done in silence. Everyone is welcome to come along and help, as this traditionally was a community event. Here in Wappenham we meet at the Church at 10pm.


